Group Counselor Job Description

Group Counselors are Day Camp's older and more experienced counselors. They are directly in charge of taking care of small groups of children.

Responsibilities:
The main responsibility of a Group Counselor is to create a safe and fun environment for campers. The campers should be the Group Counselors' main focus at all times. You accompany your small group of campers to all activities and participate with them, and play with and supervise them during rest times. You are expected to ride the bus with your group to and from camp. Group Counselors may be asked to organize and lead certain games or other activities. Because of this leadership role as a Group Counselor, you are especially expected to exhibit correct and appropriate language, behavior, and a positive attitude with the campers at all times.
Relationships:
You will be accountable to the Camp Director and Asst. Director.
Pay*:
Level 1 Counselor:\$8.75/hr
Level 2 Counselor: at least 2 years of leadership experience in youth programming.—Starting at \$9.00/hr
Level 3 Counselor: 3 or more years of leadership experience in youth programming.—Starting at \$9.25/hr
Restrictions:
Group Counselors must be at least 16 years preferably with experience working directly with children in a leadership role. They must be able to pass a 3-check screening process, which includes a background check, a reference check and interview.

^{*}Pay increases are considered for exceptionally experienced candidates, on a case-by-case basis.

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Junior Counselor Job Description

Junior Counselors are at least 15 years old. They have the choice of working with children directly, or aiding in the logistics of camp. The role of Junior Counselor is a volunteer position. Those serving in this position will gain invaluable organizational leadership experience, while having a blast this summer!

Responsibilities:
There are two types of Junior Counselors.
"Counselor Support" Junior Counselors are in charge of aiding the Guest Speakers and any other volunteers or program leaders. They help camp run smoothly by setting up and taking down activities, preparing snacks, and doing basic camp chores. This is a good way to get to know camp without the responsibility of looking after children.
"Camper Support" Junior Counselors are those counselors ready to work directly with the children in camp as support to the Group Counselors. They will not have their own groups of children, but they will be assigned to help out at specific times. They may be asked to give extra supervision to specific campers, or to act as an assistant to the lead counselor in a group. This is a logical prerequisite to becoming a Group Counselor.
Relationships:
You will answer to and receive your assignments from the Group Counselors, and other staff, including Church office staff and program leaders.

Restrictions:
Junior Counselors must be at least 15 years and be able to pass a 4-check screening process, which includes a grade check, reference check, church attendance check and interview.
